RECEIVED the following updates on the progress on the following events:

- i) D Day celebrations: -
 - Army Cadets are happy to be involved and lead the parade VL confirmed
 - Revd Charles Hope happy to lead the parade and provide the service by the War Memorial – VL confirmed.
 - VL contacted RBL regarding the Event but heard nothing yet
 - RN to build the stage at the Wivell triangle, size 13ft by 13ft
 - VL to order gas beacon

- Hot Metal Jazz band is booked for the Event AM confirmed
- VM to approach Keswick Street Theatre Club for a performance at the event
- CW confirmed that Scouts will be having a cake stall, with all the income going to Army Benevolent Fund
- Rainbows/Guides to do a tombola CW to organise
- Café HNW to be contacted regarding a Tea/Coffee stall Action AM
- SL to approach a local Veteran to be at the Event
- VL to use social media and the Reminder to approach local people who have done National Service to see if they wish to talk on the stage
- Hot Metal Jazz Band to be approached regarding a Bugler playing before the beacon is lit, as Graham Kendall is unavailable – Action AM

ii) Party in the Park: -

- Cricket Club have been informed about the Midsummer Events and don't have a problem with it as the County Matches follow the week after
- 'Stu- di- Doo' booked as the first act AM
- 'St Herberts School Choir' to be approached regarding a performance AM
- Emily Robinson, as well as local teachers, to be contacted for the classical music—AM
- Bands from last year to be contacted for the local bands and anthemic music –
 AM
- RN confirmed that local DJ Luke Stanger will be unavailable, but he will be able to find an alternative
- It was agreed that more catering stalls will be on side this year:
 'The Hallo Dandy' to serve alcoholic drinks, 'Mama Mia' to serve Pizza and Kebabs, Fish and Chips van and 'Luchini's Ice Cream' to be on site.
 'Cafe West' and 'Café HNW' to be open to serve food and drinks
- 'Bee Unique' will have more activities this year, RN to talk to them regarding bottled drinks – can they replace them with cartons?
- SL contacted a farmer from Lorton regarding hay bales. He can deliver 60 for the price of £300. This will be an alternative to straw bales from last year as the committee wasn't happy with the quality last year.
- Following last year's anti-social behaviour with knocked over straw bales and toilets, PB suggested hired security overnight to prevent it this year – PB to organise
- Toilets to be positioned closer to 'Muga' and securely fastened overnight- RN
